Governance and Organisational Management: MK Governance Manual and Book of Rules to be updated in the new year (2021) IL is a member of the Federation of Irish Sport and Sport for Business IL applied to Sport Ireland for formal recognition as a National Governing Body (NGB) in May 2018, and a decision was communicated in September 2018 that we would not be recognised at the time Governance restructuring - Need to separate the Board from the Executive; critical importance. Examples noted were IOC and FAI, and their lack of oversight. Further meetings to be held in early 2021 to workshop the structure and interlink this effort with new Board member searching; IL will be engaging with the Federation of Irish Sport Board Recruitment Service. 5. Schools and Irish League: MK Schools Cup which was due to take place in late March 2020 was an early loss due to COVID but it is hoped that growth that had been started will be able to continue Autumn league season in 2020 was planned but was scrapped due to a second Irish Lockdown February webinar / workshop is planned to discuss Schools and resumption of Irish Lacrosse League (ILL) competition. 6. **National Teams:** MK Update provided from each of our National Teams that competed in 2019. 2021 - Mens European Championship is still planned to proceed (21-30 July in Wroclaw, Poland) 2022 - Women's World Championship postponed to late June / early July (Towson University, Maryland, USA). A Women's team may qualify for the 2022 World Games. The European Mens Indoor Championship is 30 July - 6 August 2022 in Hannover, Germany. The Men's World U21 Championship at the University of Limerick in Ireland will be late July / early August. 7. Looking ahead: MK Full AGM planned for April 2021. Will include e-Voting on roles and responsibilities. All can attend, but only paid members can vote. Proposed workshops for Schools and the ILL planning in February 2021, Governance and Finance planning in March 2021, next AGM in April 2021. 8. Q&A: Can players on the U21 Men's team for 2022 play on the Men's Euro team in 2021? Hoping that all rosters remain unaffected by delays etc. Alternates may be brought in as required. What are current restrictions in Ireland? Schools can train, but ILL is suspended until the new year. Ireland is just coming out of second Level 5 restriction. Some loosening happening for the Christmas period. Numbers are not yet at the expected low level, so the new year is still unpredictable. Playing restrictions prohibit training and games under strict level 5 rules. State of Clubs in Ireland and Supports expected for play in the new year? Hope to address concerns and details around this in a workshop in the new year, focused on how we can rejuvenate our collegiate teams and encourage participation in these uncertain times. Will there be a team store available for Ireland & Iroquois apparel? No, due to changes in Iroquois agreement with Nike, we cannot do another run of T-shirts. We are looking into options for an EU store that can stay open permanently for Ireland Lacrosse. Eastbay will have time limited stores available throughout the year for US based supporters. Due to the changes of U21 Championship in Limerick, will the age range for the Festival teams change to reflect this? Yes, we intend to have youth and senior Mens and Womens divisions in the World Festival along with a men's Masters division. All still in planning due to the recent changes in postponement to

As the % of players in Ireland grows, will the % split of players on national teams change to reflect this?

- Short answer is yes, our goal is always to grow Irish based player participation, longer answer is to become more aware of <u>National Team Vision which is published on our website</u> and outline our growth and selection commitments.

Will there be capacity for training camps to be held in Ireland to help grow the game in Ireland?

- These tend to have a large cost to those types of events, and they don't have the correct amount of growth from the outcome. The focus is now to grow our coaching base in Ireland in order to be able to provide more continuous training. One-off events can be very useful, but they must be coupled with follow-on events to ensure sustainability, and this in-turn depends on capacity and capacity-building within Ireland.
